# FIRST TENNESSEE DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT 2ND QUARTER STATUS REPORT APRIL - JUNE 2011

#### ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- The Hancock County Historical & Genealogical Society was funded for a Federal Historic Preservation Grant for their Old Jail Restoration Project in the amount of \$11,000. The Historical & Genealogical Society received funds to restore the 1860 jail, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The building houses the local Historical & Genealogical Society, a local history museum, and the local Welcome Center.
- During the quarter, the District was very active in administration of 49 funded projects.
  These projects included funds from the Appalachian Regional Commission, Community
  Development Block Grant, Energy Efficiency Community Block Grant, Economic
  Development Administration, Local Parks Recreation Fund, State Industrial Access
  Road, and Transportation Enhancement Act.
- The U.S. Census Bureau released additional 2010 census of the population data for Tennessee counties and municipalities. New data included age distribution, census tract, block group and block data. Previously released data includes population, racial composition and occupied housing data. The data is available at the District's website <a href="https://www.ftdd.org">www.ftdd.org</a> under the Regional Statistics/FACTS heading.

### **HOUSING PROGRAMS**

- Tennessee Housing Development Agency awarded Greene County and the Town of Greeneville \$375,000 each in HOME funds for owner occupied housing rehabilitation. Staff attended grantee workshop in Nashville to receive grant documents and instructions.
- Outreach for the THDA Emergency Repair Program was provided by participating in meetings for tornado victims at South Central Elementary School in Washington County, Camp Creek Elementary School for Greene County, and the Johnson County Court House for Johnson County.
- Housing Department staff attended the 2011 HUD Community Partners meeting in Knoxville. Staff participated in sessions about the Community Development Block Grant program and the HOME program.

### AREA AGENCY ON AGING AND DISABILITY

- The 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual Conference on Aging was held on Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup> at the Millennium Centre in Johnson City. Two hundred eighty-one participants registered for the event. The keynote speaker was Mitchell Tolle nationally renowned artist, speaker and author from Berea, Kentucky. The daylong conference included the following workshops: "Important Papers", "The Impact of Chronic Conditions and Diabetes", "No Place Like Home", "One Call Club for Seniors", "Introduction to Eden Alternative", "The New Health Care Law and You", "Bed Bugs and Beyond", "Building and Maintaining Cognitive Skills", "Targeting Minorities", "Disaster Preparedness" and "Prevent Those Slips and Falls".
- The First Tennessee District Senior Olympics were held May 23<sup>rd</sup> through May 27<sup>th</sup> in Johnson City and Kingsport. The Golf Tournament was held on Tuesday, May 19<sup>th</sup> at Cattails at Meadowview. Two hundred sixty athletes participated in the week long events. There were 459 Gold, 185 Silver and 85 Bronze medals awarded for a total of 729. Events offered were Basketball, Bowling, Golf, Horseshoes, Pickleball, Shuffleboard, Swimming, Table Tennis, Track and Field, and Volleyball. Athletes participating in the District games were eligible to advance to the Tennessee Senior Olympics which was held July 22<sup>nd</sup> through July 28<sup>th</sup> in Williamson County (Franklin/Brentwood area).
- The Washington County SALT (Seniors and Law Enforcement Together) Council sponsored a Senior Crime Prevention Academy at the Jonesborough Area Senior Center. Eighty-five seniors participated in the event which was held on Wednesday, June 15, 2011. The event was held in conjunction with World Elder Abuse Awareness Day which is observed annually on June 15<sup>th</sup>. Topics covered at the Academy were: "Identity Theft" presented by FBI Special Agent Drew Scown, "Medicare Fraud" by TBI Special

Agent Barry Carrier, and "Protection from Adult Abuse" by Linda Evans with Adult Protective Services.

• The FTDD participated in the 2011 Washington County Relay for Life event that was held on Friday, June 10<sup>th</sup> at Indian Trail Middle School. Our team, Mission Possible, consisted of 35 members collecting over \$1,600 for the American Cancer Society.
